A first-place winner will be chosen from a high school division, as well as a middle school division.

## West Virginia State Fire Marshal's Office Fire Safety Video Contest

- Contest is open to Grades 6-12. Winners will be selected from two categories, middle school submissions and high school submissions
- Students may work in groups or solo.
- The video should explore fire safety topics and be 1-3 minutes long.
- Video should be both educational and informational.
- All videos should be well researched.
- Students are strongly encouraged to contact their local fire department or public fire and life safety educators or burn and fire professionals to help with their research.
- The video should include age appropriate material. Material should not demonstrate risky or otherwise unsafe behavior. Fire may only be depicted in the video through royalty-free stock footage, and not through images recorded by students as part of this contest.
- Videos must be in a YouTube compatible format: .WMV (windows media video); .AVI (windows), .MOV (mac); .MPEG;
- Comply with YouTube terms of service and specifications for user submissions and/or video uploads, located at http://www.youtube.com/t/terms and as may otherwise be posted on the YouTube website.
- Do not use copyrighted material. Be the entrant's original idea (modification of an previously published work shall not be considered an original idea). Entrants should not knowingly copy another's idea, but entries will not be excluded merely because another Entrant has a similar idea.

#### How to enter the contest:

- 1) Visit the Contest webpage at www.firemarshal.wv.gov to access the contest entry form.
- 2) Create an original fire safety video that highlights fire safety topics some ideas include:
  - Escape planning know two ways out
  - Smoke alarms
  - Alternative heating give space heaters space
  - Cooking safety, stand by your pan
  - Fire safety or older adults
  - Close the door, eyes shut doors shut
  - Smoking safety
  - Children and fire don't mix.
  - Burn awareness

Videos may be in color or black-and-white, and can be live action or animated, serious or funny. The video can be no more than three (3) minutes in length and should portray accurate fire safety information such as that found on the West Virginia State Fire Marshal's Office website or the National Fire Protection Association's website. Please note that videos featuring the use of consumer fireworks or the irresponsible and unsafe use of real fire will be disqualified.

3) Complete and submit via email to the State Fire Marshal's Office (pub ed email) with the subject line **2018 SFMO Video Contest**, an entry form that includes a working link to your video. If anyone other than yourself appears in the video, you will need to submit their name and signature, an attached sheet has been provided. You may also mail a DVD with an entry form.
