Chief Jimmy Suttle with Weston Fire and Chief James Kimble of Buchannon Fire addressed the Fire Department Services Committee regarding clarification of State Funding:

1) Why are part-paid departments not eligible for the VFD Equipment and Training Grant Fund? In response Commissioner Oldaker and Chairman Gunnoe noted the Commission was not involved when the Legislation was introduced and that when it was passed it was done so without funding. The funding was later transferred into the account from various sources. Chairman Gunnoe explained he felt it was put into effect in an effort to help just the Volunteer Departments as Combination or Part-Paid departments had funds via their municipalities.

As it stands, the Equipment and Training Grant Fund won't be open until FY27 which will allow Combination or Part-Paid departments time to approach their delegates on their inclusion and allow the Commission to do the same.

- 2) Chief Suttle and Chief Kimble also voiced concerns about how State Funding is dispersed to Fire Departments as there doesn't appear to be any rhyme or reason on the amounts dispersed. Some departments are receiving a full share or greater share than other departments with like numbers of volunteers/paid members. A discussion was held on the definition of Paid Department, Part Paid and Volunteer, and the factors that could be driving the amounts dispersed. Further research needs to be done by the Fire Marshal's Office on the matter for clarification.
- 3) Lastly, Chief Kimble raised concerns over small cities that are allowing their city employees to run as volunteer fire personnel while they are at work. He thinks that the Fire Commission may need to identify that process and create a standard or an MOU between the city and the fire departments that are doing so, due to potential workers' compensation issues. Chairman Gunnoe noted that as a Commission as long as the departments are providing us with documentation that they have Worker's Comp the Commission can't dictate what type of plan they have.

1. Public Service Training Report

Robert Bailey reported that last week that PST spent 2.5 days with a site visit team from the International Fire Service Accreditation Congress (IFSAC) and as a result PST was able to add 29 additional courses to their IFSAC offerings which brings them up to 35 courses. It is good news, and it puts them in the top 10 of training entities offering IFSAC. Update on the Pineville office - they are moved in, phone service has been established and the new specialist for the Pineville office is Mike Johnson. The ESCAPE Conference is February 24th through 28th, ²⁰²⁶ at Pipestem.

Robert Bailey reported that during their IFSAC visit previously mentioned, they asked those in attendance how they were handling the NFPA 1010 adoptions, and they were taking the same approach as the Commission has been through AHJ exclusions.

Chairman Gunnoe confirmed with PST that they are not asking the Commission to adopt NFPA 1010 in whole but only the portions pertaining to Firefighter 1 and Firefighter 2 to which Mr. Bailey replied in the affirmative. A discussion was held on the best means to put the wording on the certificate, and it was determined that it would be best to reference §87CSR8 on the certificate. Mr. Bailey offered to work on a Certificate over the next week for the Commission and Counsel to review. Mr. Bailey also confirmed that

the hours would remain at 120 and that the packet he presented confirmed those hours along with the other Commission requests.

Commissioner Mongold also clarified for the purpose of the minutes that while the Firefighter 1 and Firefighter 2 course is IFSAC approved, that doesn't mean that students have to take the IFSAC test, that is strictly voluntary, and the Fire Commission test is still accepted. Mr. Bailey confirmed that as well.

Commissioner Mongold made a motion to recommend to the full commission to approve the package as presented by PST as a pilot program for Firefighter 1 and Firefighter 2 which meets but does not exceed the Firefighter training in 87CSR8 with the final motion wording to be reviewed and approved by legal counsel, seconded by Commissioner Keefer.
